BETTER BUSINESS BUREAU ALERT

The Better Business Bureau is alerting the public about a recent phone scam targeting the people about flag replacement.

An Oak Lawn resident received a call allegedly from the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) inquiring if they were in need of a new flag and old flag disposal. The caller directs potential victims to write a check for \$50.00 and place it in an envelope with the flag that is to be replaced for pick-up.

The VFW confirmed that they do not provide any flag replacement services.

If you receive a suspicious call from an unknown number asking for money, the BBB recommends individuals do the following:

- **Check with the BBB:** Please visit www.bbb.org to view reports on the alleged business.
- **Take Notes:** write down as much contact information as possible including person's name, phone number, etc.
- **Do your research:** search the company for a website or call them directly to see if they provide this type of service.
- **Be smart with your money:** never wire money or leave checks or cash to people or organizations you don't know.
- **Protect yourself:** never give personal information, including social security, bank or credit card numbers, over the phone to an unknown telemarketer, or anybody else without a specific need to know.

Also, please remember during the spring time the BBB always sees an increase in scams, especially in the home improvement industry.



SAFETY MANAGER ORIGINAL ENTRANCE

DUTIES: Under general direction, manages the safety programs for the entire District.

REQUIREMENTS: The following requirements must be met by June 26, 2011:

1. Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with a major in occupational safety and health, safety technology, engineering, or allied sciences. Seven years of experience in the development, implementation and communication of safety programs in an industrial, construction, manufacturing or process environment, including three years in a supervisory capacity. Possession of the Certified Safety Professional credential. **Substitution:** Additional experience in the development, implementation and communication of safety programs may be substituted for the required education on a year-for-year basis. An additional two years of related supervisory experience may be substituted for possession of the Certified Safety Professional credential.
2. Domicile: within the boundaries of the District within six months of successful completion of probation. (The District is in Cook County, Illinois covering approximately 90% of the county area.)

SALARY: The current salary range is \$92,552.20 to \$133,829.54 per year with appointment usually made at the first (entry) step.

THE EXAMINATION will consist of an oral test, including a written exercise, weighted 100%. Candidates must achieve a passing score to have their names placed on the eligible list. The oral test will assess candidates' knowledge, skill and ability in areas such as safety principles, practices and procedures of construction, plant and office environments; recent developments, current literature and tools and technology in environmental health and safety; coordination of safety programs; training fundamentals and curriculum development; supervision and management; interpersonal skills; developing and directing comprehensive safety programs; analysis of safety related operational problems and the development of solutions; budget preparation and management; fostering cooperation for safety programs throughout the organization; and written and oral communication.

APPLICATION AND EXAMINATION PROCESS:

1. Applications may be obtained from the **Employment Service Office** of the District by phoning (312) 751-5100 or by visiting the District's web site at: www.mwrd.org. **The filing period for this examination will be from Friday, April 29, 2011, through Friday, May 27, 2011.** Completed applications must be filed by one of the following methods:
 - a. Delivered to the **Employment Service Office**, weekdays from 8:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. from April 29, 2011 through May 27, 2011.
 - b. Sent by mail to the **Employment Service Office**, Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, First Floor, 100 East Erie Street, Chicago, IL 60611. Applications sent by mail must bear a postmark no earlier than April 29, 2011 and no later than May 27, 2011.
 - c. Submitted online through the District's Online Employment Center at www.mwrd.org from April 29, 2011 through May 27, 2011. Applications must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. Central Time on May 27, 2011.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that the application form is completed and submitted in a timely manner by one of the methods described above. Descriptions and dates of education, experience and/or credentials should be very clear so that it is understood exactly how the applicant meets the minimum requirements.
2. All applicants will be advised in writing if they have been admitted to the examination process. Applicants who do not receive a response to their application by June 17, 2011 should contact the Employment Service Office at (312) 751-5100. The tentative dates of the oral test are **Friday, June 24, 2011** and **Saturday, June 25, 2011** (if necessary to accommodate the number of candidates). Candidates will be informed in writing of the date, time and place of the oral test.

VERIFICATION OF QUALIFICATIONS: Prospective employees will be required to provide documentation of the required education, experience and/or credentials upon employment.

APPOINTMENTS will be made from an eligible list with three categories: A (Exceptionally Well Qualified), B (Well Qualified) and C (Qualified). Candidates in the highest category will be given first consideration for appointment. This examination is also being given on a Promotional basis. In instances where both Original Entrance and Promotional eligible lists result from an examination process, it is the District's practice to appoint only from the Promotional eligible list until all vacancies from that list have been considered. The probationary period for this classification is one year. The eligible list has a duration of three years. New employees will be required to pass a physical examination which will include a drug test.

GENERAL INFORMATION – CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS

THE DISTRICT'S MERIT SYSTEM OF EMPLOYMENT

The civil service system of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago was created by enactment of a statute of the Legislature of the State of Illinois (70 ILCS 2605/4.7) (1992). This examination, including provisions relating to the meeting of qualifications, the filing of applications, the administration of the examination, Veterans' Preference, and the issuance and use of eligible lists, is in accordance with this statute.

Examinations may be announced on (1) an Original Entrance basis with all candidates meeting the requirements of the position being eligible to compete; (2) a Promotional basis with only those District employees with civil service status and time in grade in subordinate classes being eligible to compete; (3) both an Original Entrance and a Promotional basis.

FILING AN APPLICATION

1. **Application Required for Each Examination:** To compete in any civil service examination you must fill out and file an application on a form provided by the Human Resources Department on or before the filing period closing date listed on the other side of this sheet.
2. **Admission Letter:** An applicant who is accepted as qualified to take a particular civil service examination will receive an admission letter. It is the applicant's responsibility to present this letter for admission to the examination.
3. **Filing for Separate Examinations on the Same Day:** Applicants who qualify for separate examinations being held at the same time must complete a separate application for each examination and will be issued an admission letter for each exam. All admission letters are to be presented at the testing site on the date of the examinations and candidates will be instructed as to the sequence of their examinations. If the examinations are scheduled at different sites, arrangements will be made and candidates will be instructed about where they are to report.
4. **Verification of Information:** All statements and information on an application including education and employment history are subject to verification at the time a candidate's name is placed on an eligible list. On request, contact with the last employer may be postponed until a firm job offer is made. Falsification of a material statement in an application may constitute grounds for rejection of the application, exclusion from the examination, removal from the eligible list, or discharge of an employee from his or her position in the Classified Service.

ON DATE OF EXAMINATION

1. Candidates are to appear promptly at the test report time. Candidates who are late may not be admitted. Allow yourself sufficient time to park and to report to the test.
2. Written civil service tests normally take from two to four hours. Park your car in a place where you can leave it for the full time of the test.
3. If you require glasses or a hearing aid, be certain to bring them with you to the test.
4. Bring any specialized equipment or materials which may be specified on the other side of this sheet.
5. Textbooks, reference works, etc., will not be allowed in the test room unless they are specifically permitted by a statement on the other side of this sheet.

VETERANS' PREFERENCE

1. In Original Entrance examinations, five points for Veterans' Preference will be added in accordance with the Statute to those candidates who attain a passing score in all phases of the examination. Veterans' Preference claim forms, information regarding the period of eligible service, and the documentation needed will be provided at the test site.
2. Certain limitations govern the use of Veterans' Preference for Promotional examinations.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY INFORMATION

1. **Testing Accommodations:** Reasonable testing accommodations for persons with disabilities will be made in accordance with the applicable laws. Requests for testing accommodations are to be made within one week after the close of the filing period. For information call (312)751-5170 (voice) or (312)751-5916 (TTY).
2. **Voluntary Equal Employment Opportunity Information Form:** This form, the completion of which is optional, is on the bottom of the employment application. If you choose to volunteer the requested information, please note that this information is kept in a confidential file and will be used for statistical purposes only.

NOTE TO CURRENT EMPLOYEES

Employees may not hold civil service status in more than one classification. Therefore, achievement of civil service status in the classification that is the subject of this announcement will result in the loss of eligibility for promotional examinations resulting from the possession of civil service status in any former classification.

Certification as a Certified Safety Professional by the Board of Certified Safety Professionals. **Substitution:** Additional experience in the development, implementation or communication of safety programs in the workplace may be substituted for the required education on a year-for-year basis. An additional two years of related supervisory experience may be substituted for possession of the Certified Safety Professional credential.
2. Domiciled within the boundaries of the District within six months of successful completion of application. (The District is in Cook County, Illinois covering approximately 90% of the county area.)

SALARY: The current salary range is \$82,467.70 to \$121,234.88 per year with appointment usually made at the first (entry) step.

THE EXAMINATION will consist of an oral test, including a written exercise, weighted 100%. Candidates must achieve a passing score to have their names placed on the eligible list. The oral test will assess candidates' knowledge, skill and ability in areas such as safety principles, practices and procedures of construction plant and office environments; recent developments, current literature and tools and technology in environmental health and safety; coordination of safety programs; training fundamentals and curriculum development; supervision and management; interpersonal skills, and written and oral communication.


