

## Water Division Manager

The Village of Oak Lawn is currently seeking qualified applicants for the full-time position of Water Division Manager. Oak Lawn residents who meet or exceed the qualifications are encouraged to apply.

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES: Oversees the Village of Oak Lawn Regional Water System. Supervises the construction and repair of water mains and the operation of the water pumping stations.

DISTINGUISHED FEATURES OF THE CLASS: The Water Division Manager provides the necessary directions and supervision to work crews, both skilled semi-skilled and unskilled; and field operations as they relate to repair of all water distribution facilities. Oversees the operation of the water pumping stations to meet the needs of the retail and wholesale customers.

- Participates in meetings and review of design and construction milestones for the Regional Water System
- Attends regular meetings with the Regional Water System customers.
- Oversees the Regional Water System Asset Management Plan

- Works with Public Works Director developing Water Division budget

- Must possess a valid State Driver's license and Illinois Class C Water Plant Operator License desired (or obtain an Illinois Class C Water Plant Operator License within 12 months of employment).
- Experience should include operations and maintenance of large stations and water transmission systems including installation and maintenance of water piping, water mains and related services.
- Knowledge of project management techniques, OSHA, IDOT, and ANSI standards desirable.
- Ability to supervise personnel; previous Crew Chief experience preferred.



The Oak Lawn Regional Water System serves to store and distribute potable water (i.e., Chicago water), purchased from the City of Chicago to the Village of Oak Lawn and 12 wholesale water customers of the Village. The \$171 Million Regional Water System Improvements program is scheduled to be completed prior to 2019 and consists of the following major construction bid packages:

- Early Out Bid Package: Reich and Harker Motor Control Center, Vault and Valve Modifications
- Bid Package No. 1: Modifications at Harker Complex
- Bid Package No. 2: Modifications at Reich Complex and Points of Delivery
- Bid Package No. 3: Booster Pumping Station Nos. 1 and 2 Improvements
- Bid Package No. 4: Transmission Main – 60-inch from Reich Complex to Cal-Sag Channel Crossing
- Bid Package Nos. 5 and 6: Transmission Main – 60-inch Cal-Sag Channel Crossing and through ComEd Corridor to 151st Street via ComEd Corridor and Cook County's Forest Preserve
- Bid Package No. 7: Transmission Main – 24-inch Connection to Orland Park and 36/42-inch Cross-Town Connection to Booster Pumping Station No. 2


