Keeping residents up to speed with the latest Village news

STATE SHARED REVENUE UPDATE

Municipalities in Illinois receive certain shared revenues from the State. Information regarding the figures from May 2009 through the end of December 2009 was recently published. It demonstrates the significant declines in shared revenues from the State, which poses additional hardships on municipalities.

MUNICIPAL INCOME TAX revenue documented by the Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR) from May through December was \$51.79 per capita. That is down 16% from the \$61.63 during the same eight months of 2008.

MUNICIPAL MOTOR FUEL TAX revenue distributed by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) from May through December was \$16.63 per capita. That is down 2.1% from the \$17.04 received during the same eight months of 2008.

MUNICIPAL USE TAX revenue distributed by the IDOR from May through December was \$7.96 per capita. That is down 17.1% from the \$9.60 received during the same eight months of 2008.

CORPORATE PERSONAL PROPERTY REPLACEMENT TAX (CPRT) revenue distributed by the IDOR from May through December was \$788 million. That is down 14.6% from the \$923 million received during the same eight months of 2008.

MUNICIPAL SALES TAX REVENUE:

The amount of 1% statutory Municipal Sales Tax revenue distributed by the IDOR from May through December was \$942 million. That is down 10.5% from the \$1.052 billion received during the same eight months of 2008. The May decline was 14.6%, June was 7.3%, July was 13.0%, August was 10.4%, September was 10.8%, October was 9.6%, November was 10.8% and December was 7.8%.
