Bede as an art teacher, said she loves the neighborhood feel of Oak Lawn. The couple lived in Bellville and Burbank before settling in Oak Lawn. Katie, who works part time at St.






Advocate Children's Hospital was the recipient of a \$50,000 Impact Grant through Hyundai's Hope On Wheels initiative.

Hyundai Hope On Wheels® Event Grants \$50k to Advocate Children's

On July 7th, Advocate Children's Hospital was one of only 18 nationwide recipients of a \$50,000 Hyundai Impact Grant from the auto manufacturer's Hope On Wheels initiative. The grant was awarded at a special "Handprint Ceremony" commemorating children affected by cancer. During the ceremony, young cancer patients dipped their hands in paint to create colorful handprints on a white Hyundai Tucson — the Hyundai Hope On Wheels hero vehicle.

The Hyundai Hope On Wheels charity was founded in 1998, and since then has awarded more than \$115 million for research to Children's Oncology Group member institutions nationwide, with the goal of supporting innovative research and growing awareness of childhood cancer. This year alone, Hyundai Hope On Wheels will award more than \$13 million in grants to institutions across the country.

Diana Tousignant has been an emergency telecommunications for 15 years, and she is honored and excited to be able to serve the wonderful community of Oak Lawn in her professional capacity.

A graduate of Morton East High School, Diana also has a Bachelor's Degree in Business from Benedictine University with emphasis on Human Resources.

As Director of Communications, Diana has a lot of responsibility. "I am responsible for overall management of all Communications Center functions," she explains. "I am a department head and employee of the Village of Oak Lawn. I have a communications staff of one Oak Lawn Technology Team Leader, three Oak Lawn Operations Team Leaders, four NORCOMM Shift Team Leaders and 23 NORCOMM Telecommunicators who report directly to me. I represent the Communications department to citizens, civic groups, other governmental entities and others to explain departmental operations and services, and to



respond to inquiries and concerns. I develop and implement administrative and operational budgets, purchases and equipment."

The Village's Communications Center handles all emergency and non-emergency calls and dispatches for the police and fire departments of the Village of Bridgeview, City of Burbank, Village of Evergreen Park and the Village of Oak Lawn. In addition, the center dispatches for the Villages of Bedford Park and the Central Stickney fire departments. Last year, the center fielded an impressive 191,681 emergency and non-emergency calls, and processed a total of 196,760 calls for service.

"I started my career as an Emergency Telecommunicator 15 years ago," Diana recalls. "During my career, I have worked for large, single-city agencies and consolidated agencies, all located in the Western Suburbs of Chicago."

Diana was promoted to a supervisory capacity in 2005 and has since remained at management level, maintaining a strong background as a training coordinator with numerous professional certifications to her credit. "I am a Registered Public Leader (RPL) through the Association for Public Communications Officials (APCO), an Emergency Numbers Professional (ENP) through the National Emer-

gency Numbers Association (NENA) and I have completed the Communications Center Manager Program (CMCP) through (NENA)," she says.

"I am also active and serve on three committees through Illinois APCO and APCO International," she adds. "I serve as Vice Chair on the Occupational/Process Analysis Sub-Committee. One of these committees focuses on national standards for handling emergency calls."

Diana cites her supervisory experience and her educational background as being instrumental in her career, but at the heart of it all, she firmly believes in the good work that her department does, and the impact she is able to have on the thousands upon thousands of lives they touch. "Public safety is my passion and number one priority," she says. "I look forward to providing our citizens and first responders with the highest level of care and exceptional customer service."

Diana was born to Czech parents and raised in Cicero, Ill. With her husband, David Tousignant, she has one son, and they have two grandsons. Trash Facts: Our Nation's Landfills

Although 75 percent of our trash can be recycled, the EPA set a national goal of 25 percent for 1992.

The first real recycling program was introduced in New York City in the 1890s. The city's first recycling plant was built in 1898.

By 1924, 83 percent of American cities were separating some trash items to be reused.

About one third of an average dump is made up of packaging material.

Every year, each American throws out about 1,200 pounds of organic garbage that can be composted.

New Jersey has the highest recycling rate of all the states — 56 percent.

The United States is the No. 1 trash-producing country in the world, at 1,609 pounds per person per year. This means that 5 percent of the world's population generates about 40 percent of the world's waste.

The accompanying chart shows the composition of an av-

erage garbage dump. Notice how much of it is recyclable!

The highest man-made point in Ohio is said to be "Mount Rumpke," which is actually a mountain of trash at the Rumpke sanitary landfill.

The United States population discards each year 16,000,000,000 diapers, 1,600,000,000 pens, 2,000,000,000 razor blades, 220,000,000 car tires, and enough aluminum to rebuild the U.S. commercial air fleet four times over.

Speaking of diapers, a cloth diaper washed at home costs 3 cents per use. A disposable diaper costs 22 cents per use. The difference can add up — a typical baby will use about 10,000 diapers.


Between 5 and 15 percent of what we throw away contains hazardous substances.

Out of every \$10 spent buying things, \$1 (10 percent) goes for packaging that is thrown away. Packaging represents about 65 percent household trash.

On average, it costs \$30/ton to recycle trash, \$50/ton to

send it to the landfill, and \$65 to \$75/ton to incinerate it.


Americans generate and throw away 9 times as much waste as does a person in Africa or Central America, but we also generate two to three times the amount of waste as people living in industrialized countries with a comparable or better standard of living.



Reminder to Residents: Regarding Power Outages

In the event that your home loses power, it is very important that you contact ComEd to report the outage. Don't assume that your address will be included if your neighbor calls. It is also important that you have certain information at the ready (e.g., your account number with ComEd, or the phone number associated with your account) so that you can accurately report your outage electronically. In a mass-outage situation, waiting to talk to an operator can take a significant amount of time. Save your account information as well as the ComEd emergency phone number (1-800-Edison-1, or 1-800-334-7661) in your contacts on your cell phone because you may not be able to look it up when your power goes out. If you have a smartphone, you can download an app from ComEd that provides access to reporting an outage as well as updates of restoration times. If your outage lasts beyond the expected time of restoration, call back to re-report your outage. On rare occasions there can be multiple causes for your outage.

Myths of Pregnancy: Can I eat sushi, use hair dye and drink caffeine?



ComEd Announces New Default Service Rates

As an Oak Lawn resident, you participate in the Village of Oak Lawn’s municipal aggregation electric program. In 2014, the Village evaluated options to provide residential and small commercial customers with a long-term, fixed-rate option for their electric usage. The program guarantees participants a fixed rate of 7.25 cents per kilowatt-hour through March 2017.

ComEd recently announced new default service rates. ComEd’s base rates are defined through May 2017, but may vary higher or lower month to month, based on a monthly true-up component called the Purchased Electric Adjustment (PEA):



*Preliminary rates that will be adjusted after additional wholesale electricity is procured in September.

If you decide to opt-out of the program and return to ComEd, under the current provisions of ComEd’s tariff, you will not be allowed to re-enroll in the program for a period of six months.

West Nile Prevention Efforts Prove Effective

Due to the fine work of the Oak Lawn Public Works Division, South Cook County Mosquito Abatement District, Cook County and Illinois Departments of Health, who applied larvicide in all storm drains and stagnant water, we have driven down the number of mosquitoes in the area. Property Maintenance Division has sought out potential breeding areas. Property owners have been reminded to eliminate any stagnant water, keep pool water clean and circulated, remove debris, eliminate weeds and keep lawns, alleys, parkways and bushes trimmed to remove potential conditions that are friendly to mosquitoes. July and August are the most active months for mosquitoes and the diseases they spread. Now is the time to be vigilant in finding and eliminating insect and rodent breeding conditions on your property. The

most active time for mosquitoes is from dusk to dawn. During that time it is especially necessary to use mosquito repellent with Deet, and to wear long sleeves and pants to prevent bites that could cause illness in addition to being an annoyance.

Thanks to all residents who have worked to keep our neighborhood safe by removing these trouble spots. Please keep up the good work.

Lietz Era as Principal Begins At OLCHS with Energetic Ideas, Vision, Enthusiasm



Dr. Jeana Lietz, the new principal at Oak Lawn Community High School, has a new vision for what the school can be for students and for the community.

As Oak Lawn Community High School rolls out the red carpet to welcome new principal Dr. Jeana Lietz for the coming school year, she has already begun implementing new ideas by greeting incoming freshman with a welcome of her own called the “Welcome Wagon.” This is a program consisting of staff and administrators personally visiting incoming freshmen to help make them feel a part of the OLCHS community before they ever step on campus. And it has been received with smiles and good feelings.

“Years ago while researching my dissertation about Fred Rogers, I heard about an elementary principal who went and visited her incoming kindergartners to give them a friendly face when they came to school in the fall,” Lietz said. “I thought that the transition to high school is another, perhaps even scarier, transition for students and parents. The Welcome Wagon allows us to put some of those fears to rest, while sending the message that we value our students and parents.

“I hope that this will also lead into high parental involvement throughout the school year. It has been fun to visit houses and meet some of our students. And the staff has truly stepped up to help us visit all 425 houses.”

Lietz began as assistant principal at OLCHS in 2011 and finished her fifth year at the school before getting
