FIRST QUARTER FINANCIAL UPDATE

During the first quarter of 2010, the Village's \$38.8 million general fund budget was approximately \$1 million under the budget for actual departmental expenditures (\$8.7 million as compared to a \$9.7 million budget for the quarter and \$9.6 million for the first quarter of 2009) but lagged \$1.3 million behind on actual revenues (\$8.7 million as compared to \$10.0 million in budgeted revenues). There was some evidence of economic recovery in the Village as sales tax revenue of \$2.933 million was right on target with the \$2.939 budget for the quarter. By comparison, the sales tax revenues for the first quarter of 2009 were roughly \$2.84 million.

There was not any major issue with property tax collections during the early part of 2010. The primary concern of the Village's management team is the approximate \$1.4 million in state income, replacement and other tax payments due to the Village by the State of Illinois. This includes an estimated \$1.1 million of unpaid income tax receipts from 2009 and another estimated \$300,000 during the first quarter of 2010. The State of Illinois' budgetary shortfall has had a dramatic negative impact on the Village's cash flow and management's ongoing effort to balance the budget during a very difficult economy.

We will continue making all efforts to provide an excellent level of services while being fiscally responsible.



PROPERTY MAINTENANCE SPRING CLEANING TIDBITS

THE PROPERTY MAINTENANCE DIVISION WOULD LIKE TO ENCOURAGE EVERYONE TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE BEAUTIFUL SPRING WEATHER AND GET YOUR PROPERTY READY FOR SUMMER. HERE ARE REMINDERS OF A FEW OF THE ITEMS INSPECTORS WILL BE LOOKING FOR THROUGHOUT THE VILLAGE:

- All pools over 23" deep must be protected by a fence at least 4 foot high. Larger pools may require permits for installation, please check with the Building Department. Pool water must be treated and circulated at least 1 hour each week and wading pools emptied every week to eliminate mosquito breeding areas.
- Eliminate weeds and keep grass trimmed to 4 inches in yards, parkways and alleys.
- Keeping garbage and yard waste contained and covered will prevent rodents.
- Address numbers should be clearly posted on your home for your safety and for emergency responders.
- Unlicensed or inoperable vehicles must be removed or garaged. Vehicles can only be parked on asphalt or concrete surfaces.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT

Village of Oak Lawn Larvicide Treatment begins May 10

Beginning the week of May 10 the Village of Oak Lawn Sewer Division will be treating all storm water catch basins with environmentally safe larvicide, ALTOCID XR, to reduce the mosquito population for the next 150 days. The spring weather this year indicates that we may be in for a larger population of mosquitoes than we have had in the past few summers. Personal protection is always advised to prevent mosquito bites and the potential for contracting West Nile Virus. Spray yourself and children with repellent containing up to 35% Deet, follow label directions for use.

- Avoid outdoor activities from dusk to dawn. If it is not possible then wear long sleeves, long pants and avoid scented products.
- Keep grass and shrubs well trimmed and cut away from sidewalks and path
- Pools must have water circulated and filters run every 5 days and wading pools must be drained weekly
- Keep downspouts and gutters clear and free of debris
- Flower pots, toys and other items that retain water should be drained frequently. Tires must be removed or garaged.
- Birdbaths and bird feeders should be eliminated as they allow sick birds to congregate and infect healthy birds
- Repair or replace all torn or broken screens in windows or doors
