OAK LAWN POLICE DEPARTMENT RESPONDS TO BANK ROBBERY

The Oak Lawn Police responded to an Armed Robbery in progress at the Bank of America located at 4046 W 111th Street. The offender had gained entry into the bank through a hole cut in the roof. Once inside, he confronted two tellers while armed with a handgun. A silent alarm was activated; the alarm company began to monitor the situation in the bank and was relaying information to emergency dispatchers who in turn relayed the information on the offenders actions to responding units. As the Oak Lawn Units were arriving on the scene, the offender exited the bank through the same hole in the roof that he had entered. This information was relayed to units on the scene and they observed the offender on the roof. Responding officers requested assistance in setting up a perimeter around the building. The rapid response from Oak Lawn units and police units from Evergreen Park, Alsip, Hometown, Marionette Park, and Chicago created a perimeter from which the offender could not escape. The South Suburban Emergency Response Team (SSERT) was requested to respond to the location and 54 officers from 33 different police departments responded. Knowing the magnitude of the unfolding incident, the Illinois Emergency Alarm System (ILEAS) was contacted and additional units from more than 15 law enforcement agencies responded to assist in things such as traffic control. The location of the incident command post was designated. Patrons of the various businesses in the Ranch Manor Shopping center were sheltered in place. After the SSERT team was assembled, command staff from the Oak Lawn Police and SSERT developed a plan that would first safely remove the patrons from the various stores, search, and then secure the stores on the ground floor. Once all the patrons were safely removed, it became apparent that the offender was confined to the second story offices. The building owner was brought to the scene in an effort to gather information about the construction of the building. A new plan was now formed by Oak Lawn Police, SSERT, FBI, and the Cook County Sheriff's Department which included using electronic surveillance equipment and robotic cameras to safely view unsearched areas of the second floor. Through the use of this equipment, the most likely location of the offender was determined which was in the rafter area of the second floor offices. It was determined that the safest way for the police officers and the

offender to conduct this search was to remove the ceiling and a methodical search began. The offender was ultimately located in a small area between a wall and the heating and air conditioning duct work. The offender was wedged so tight that the duct work needed to be removed to free him. The offender was safely taken into custody. By the time that the subject was taken into custody, 54 law enforcement agencies and almost 200 police officers had responded to the scene.

Village Manager Larry Deetjen salutes Oak Lawn Chief of Police Bill Villanova and his team along with the many fine law enforcement professionals from the federal, state, county, and municipal ranks. Bank of America, the ownership of the Ranch Manor Shopping Center and the Shop Owners as well were examples of how citizens and businesses alike can provide "invaluable" assistance in fighting and deterring crime.

"The apprehension of the bank robber suspect without further incident" is a model of how years of training and regional cooperation of police agencies in Illinois pays off. A total of 54 law enforcement agencies provided resources on Saturday, June 2, 2012 in Oak Lawn for over 10 hours as the suspect attempted to evade police who buttoned down the site perimeter and methodically, through the night, followed his movement in dark and close attic conditions with the utmost attention to the safety of residents, customers, officers, and other interested parties. The suspect was believed to be armed and hours after his capture "without further incident" a fully loaded weapon was recovered from the scene and processed by FBI authorities for further evidence. The suspect has a long history of crime. He will be brought to trial for the protection of society thanks to outstanding police work. Oak Lawn residents and businesses know they have the "finest" police officers and on Saturday they exhibited their skills along with the professional assistance from other outstanding law enforcement personnel. The village thanks all of the law enforcement agencies as well for a job well done! In the words of a Cook County police officer in the early morning hours after word was radioed to all standing by that "contact had been made" and the "suspect was being taken into custody after removal from an overhead vent system," It sure is great to see a plan come together so nicely." Well said Officer and well done Chief Villanova and troops!

I ACKNOWLEDGE THAT RIDING A BICYCLE ON A PUBLIC STREET OR OTHER PROPERTY CAN BE AN INHERENTLY DANGEROUS ACTIVITY AND FULLY REALIZE THE DANGERS OF PARTICIPATING IN THE EVENT, whether as a rider, volunteer or otherwise and fully assume the risks associated with such participation including, by way of example and not limitation: the dangers of collision with pedestrians, vehicles, or other riders, and fixed or moving objects; the dangers arising from surface hazards including potholes, uneven or cracked surfaces, bumps, equipment failure, inadequate safety equipment, the Releasees' own negligence, the negligence of others and weather conditions; and the possibility of serious physical and/or mental trauma or injury, or death associated with the Event.


WORKING BIKES



PUBLIC HEALTH REMINDER:

Mosquito season is here and we want to remind you to protect yourself and your family from bites and the potential for West Nile Virus.

Use mosquito repellent containing at least 25% DEET, apply according to directions. Wear socks, long pants and long sleeves when out between dusk and dawn. Keep grass trimmed to 4 inches or less and eliminate overgrowth.

Bushes and shrubs should be trimmed out of any walking path. Eliminate all stagnant water; gutters must flow freely, pools must be properly maintained, empty birdbaths, toys, planters and any water holding equipment. Have a safe summer!



MOSQUITO REPELLENT USE RECOMMENDATIONS:

During the months of mosquito activity, the use of repellent is highly recommended. Proper use of DEET containing products will help protect you from bites and, therefore, the potential diseases that can be transmitted from the mosquito. Personal protections provided by use of repellents is safe and wise when used correctly.

Always read product label before applying. Adults should apply repellents to children.

Apply a light, even coating of DEET containing repellent to any exposed skin. Even an area as small as a dime is susceptible to mosquito bites. Rub, spray, or spritz repellents evenly on skin to ensure full coverage. Avoid leaving protection to chance by using ineffective products such as bath oils.

When applying repellent to the face, apply it to hands first and then rub it on the face, keeping away from lips, mouth, eyes or over cuts or irritated skin.

As an added safeguard, apply repellent to clothing, checking product label first for cautions against contact with certain types of fabrics. Do not apply to skin under clothing.

Remember that hot and humid conditions and increased physical activity may require that you apply a repellent more frequently. When mosquitoes begin landing on treated skin, it is time to reapply repellent.

Activities in the sun require both sun and insect protection. For maximum protection, you should select a specially formulated product that combines both DEET insect repellent and sunscreen. You should know that mixing products could significantly reduce the amount of protection offered by both products. After your outdoor activity, wash repellent-treated skin with soap and water.

DEET insect repellents are available in a variety of concentrations. Higher percentages of DEET, (25%), deliver longer protection. You should select the right concentration for you based on the type of outdoor activity and length of time you will be out doors. Higher concentrations are recommended for outdoor activities in areas with high mosquito populations. Proper use of insect repellent will allow you to enjoy a safe and happy summer.


SUMMER SUNDAY HOURS




