PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL MEETING
TUESDAY, APRIL 30, 2013**

Made possible through funding by the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP), the Village is working with Teska Associates to identify opportunities for improvements along the corridor. Improvements may include new shops and dining, safer pedestrian crossings, bike routes and amenities, landscaping and community signage.



Postpartum Adjustment Support Group – A free support group offers resources that will allow new mothers to become more knowledgeable about Postpartum Depression, its causes and available treatment options. In addition, it also will give mothers the opportunity to talk, listen and share their experiences with other women experiencing similar feelings.
