What the Village is doing


The Village has taken a number of steps to address:

- 1) the capacity issues of the storm sewer system
- 2) the capacity issues of the sanitary sewer system

Village Action on Storm Water Detention



- In August of 2010 the Village applied for \$13,860,000 in funds under the Federal TIGER II Program to reconstruct 103rd street including the storm sewer system and add underground storm water detention

Village Action on Storm Water Detention

- Oak Lawn Park District is conceptually open to underground storm water detention at Brandt Park, Dillon Park and/or Memorial Park.
- Approximate cost of underground detention \$350,000 per acre-foot
- Size of Oakdale pond 4.6 acre-feet
- Cost of Oakdale pond \$2.9 Million (includes land)
- Size of St Casimir reservoir 400 acre-feet, 100 Xs larger
- Estimate cost of 400 ac-ft reservoir \$84.8 Million
- Larger reservoir more cost effective per acre-foot of storage
- Replaced 120 storm inlets per year for the past 4 years, three times the amount of previous years
- Installed drainage in 12 alleys last year, and 22 for 2011

Village Action on Sanitary Sewer

- In Spring 2010 the Village contracted CDM to prepare a Sanitary Sewer Master Plan – first time ever for Oak Lawn.
- Installed 18 flow meters and 4 rain gages in sanitary sewers. Also the first time Village was ever allowed to install flow meters in MWRD sewer system
- Renovations of 4 sanitary lift stations underway
- The report will model the entire system and recommend actions the Village Board can take to address wet weather impact on sanitary sewer, which contribute to basement backups.

- Recommend new direct sanitary sewer connection to the MWRD interceptor at 107th and Cicero
- Perform smoke and dye testing at 3 problem areas identified in the Sewer Master Plan for use in lateral repair, slip lining, and illegal connection removal.


