Property Tax Appeal Meeting

With County Commissioner John Daley

August 15, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. at the Oak Lawn Library

This year, the Cook County Assessor's Office is reassessing properties in the 17 townships located in south and west suburban Cook County. It is expected that Oak Lawn residents will start receiving reassessment notices in August.

In anticipation of this, Cook County Commissioner John Daley and Mayor Dave Heilmann will be hosting a meeting at the Oak Lawn Library on Monday, August 15, 2011 at 7:00 pm. Representatives from the office of Cook County Assessor Joseph Berrios will also be there to provide information and assistance.

Reassessment notices contain proposed values that will be reflected on second-installment tax bills, which will be due in the fall of 2012. However, once reassessment notices are received, taxpayers are entitled to file an appeal on the proposed assessments.

A single-family homeowner may compare his or her assessment with those of similar homes. These assessments are published in local newspapers, the name of the paper and the publication date can be found on the notice. The publication of assessments is also made available in public libraries. Residential data books are available at all Assessors' Office locations and may be used to find comparable properties.

The Cook County Assessor website (www.cookcountyassessor.com) allows taxpayers to search for information using a 14-digit Property Index Number (PIN) or by typing in an address. Homeowners can check their property's characteristics, as well as search for information on similar properties to use if they choose to appeal their assessments.

Residential taxpayers may also file an appeal online. By using the website residents can search for comparables and add those comparables to their online appeals.



Warning of Possible Scam

“NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM”

Oak Lawn has been advised of a possible scam regarding an alleged program for home improvements. A contractor is allegedly telling homeowners that there is a federal program called “Neighborhood Improvement Program” where the resident pays half and the government pays half for improvements to homes, such as a new furnace or window replacements.

Congressman Lipinski’s office has confirmed that there is no such program.

There is a CEDA (Community and Economic Development Association of Cook County) program that does exist and is legitimate. CEDA Weatherization is a year-round program using state-of-the-art technology to make homes more energy-efficient for qualifying low-income clients in Chicago and suburban Cook County. Weatherization provides safety and health equipment, repairs or replaces heating systems, seals air bypasses and other drafty areas, increases attic, wall, basement, and crawl space insulation. COM ED Residential Hardship Program

If you have a financial hardship due to job loss, illness, military deployment, disability, or as a senior citizen, you may be eligible for assistance through ComEd's Residential Special Hardship program. Income-eligible, residential customers can apply once every 3 years for grants of up to \$500 based on need and availability of program funds.

Qualifications

This fund applies to residential customers with household incomes up to 200% of the federal poverty level (\$44,100 for a family of four) who identify a hardship issue — including documented medical, military, senior, or disability hardships among others.

THE CHILDREN'S MUSEUM



“WE THE PEOPLE” Exhibit at the Children’s Museum

On July 20th, 2011, the Village of Oak Lawn and the Oak Lawn Rotary Club presented two small pieces of beams from the World Trade Center to the Children's Museum in Oak Lawn.

The museum plans to create an exhibit entitled "We the People..." that will focus on the elements of what happened in the days immediately following the 9/11 attacks on our country. "The focus of the exhibit will be what happened on 9/12, 9/13 and the days and weeks that followed," said Adam Woodworth the museum's Executive Director. "The central theme of this exhibit will be centered on friendship, helping others, coming together and patriotism. It was a time when Americans came together... when race, political affiliation and social status didn't matter. It was a time when we truly saw an outpouring of the American spirit throughout our country."

The Oak Lawn Rotary Club has been working with the Village of Oak Lawn to create a monument honoring first responders. The monument will be located by the Children's Museum in Oak Lawn and will include four beams from the World Trade Center and now two pieces of these beams will be located inside the Children's Museum. "Children will be able to touch a piece of history," said Woodworth. "The exhibit will strive to encourage parents and children to engage in conversations about helping others and what it means to be an American." There will be other aspects of the exhibit, but the World Trade Center beams will be the central component of the exhibit.




