

WEST NILE VIRUS

The South Cook County Mosquito Abatement District (SCCMAD), the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) have several mosquito traps set up throughout the Village of Oak Lawn. They attract mosquitoes, especially the culex pipiens which transmit West Nile Virus to humans. Every 2 or 3 days, depending on weather, the agencies empty the traps and collect all the mosquitoes. They then sort out the culex pipiens. These mosquitoes are smaller than the more common nuisance mosquitoes and have stripes on their legs. The typical testing protocol is to take a batch of 100 culex pipiens and chemically test them for the virus. Since late June the amount of virus in our samples has significantly increased.

The following precautions are recommended:

- Remove stagnant water on your property.
- Avoid being outdoor when mosquitoes are most active, especially between dusk & dawn.
- Use mosquito repellent when outdoors.
- Swimming pools must be filtered daily and wading pools emptied daily.
- Drain standing water in children's toys, tires, flower pots, bird baths, and any other item collecting water.
- Clear gutters and downspouts to allow water to drain completely.
- Repair any ripped or torn screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house.
