



State law requires an annual audit by independent certified public accountants. McGladrey LLP has served as the Village's auditors for the past five years. Village expenditures for the general fund for 2011 totaled **\$38.7 million** (excluding pension, capital outlays and refuse)

By comparison, the audited expenditures annually were as follows:

2007: \$39.9 million

2008: \$40.8 million

2009: \$39.9 million

2010: \$36.8 million (labor/employee concessions lowered expenses)

Village expenses basically increase by 2.5% to 3% each year, primarily for labor costs. Revenue has been flat due to the poor economy. In addition, the State of Illinois' budgetary shortfall has continued to negatively affect the Village's cash flow due to the delayed timing of income tax, personal property replacement tax, use tax and other tax receipts to municipalities.

2011 did experience significant revenue increases in areas such as sales taxes by almost 12%, which is a positive. There were 1,814 building permits issued during 2011 as compared to 1,799 and 1,360 in building permits in 2010 and 2009, indicating a positive increase in the level of construction activity throughout the Village.

There were 65 new businesses opened and 12 closed during the 2011 fiscal year based upon the new licenses issued.

In 2011, as during the previous six years of the current administration, the Village's major efforts remain focused on community development and infrastructure improvement. The Village continues to be a great community for families and businesses. The Village resolved matters related to its 111th & Cicero Avenue TIF development and acquired the JC Penney property for \$10.9 million at the end of November, 2011. While the developer works to secure attractive tenants, the former Kmart property has begun the demolition process (asbestos abatement, then demolition). The Village has acquired multiple properties to enable a successful long term development to replace the Kmart and closed Dominicks. It represents a commitment to improve the lifestyle of its residents while at the same time increasing the Village's tax base and provide those amenities attractive to families.

In terms of street and infrastructure expenditures, the Village spent \$4 million per year during the years from 2008 to 2010 and approximately \$8.4 million in 2011. In August 2010, the Village Board approved a \$33.5 million Build America Bond

financing for these and other infrastructure improvements, including storm water drainage and retention projects, over the three year period from 2011 thru 2013. The Build America Bond debt is paid annually through the current three cent gas tax.

As part of the Village's ongoing commitment to its water distribution business and in partnership with the city of Chicago and its twelve municipal customers, the Village authorized Camp, Dresser & McKee ("CDM") to develop a Water System Master Plan ("Water Master Plan") summarizing the \$186 million in capital improvements necessary to maintain the Village's water distribution system (the "System") as state of the art. CDM's Water Master Plan is expected to provide Oak Lawn residents and the System's twelve other municipal customers with a safe and reliable source of high-quality drinking water for future decades. As those communities grow, the System is projected to serve over 400,000 residents by 2040.

The Village is served by separate sanitary and sewer systems. Certain parts of the sanitary system experience severe surcharging during storm events. This surcharging subsequently causes problems such as manholes flooding to ground level and basement backups. These problems have been caused by improper infiltration and inflow to the system, downstream capacity restrictions, localized bottlenecks or any combination of these factors. To address these problems, the Village retained CDM to develop a comprehensive Sanitary Sewer Master Plan ("Sewer Master Plan"). The purpose of the Sewer Master Plan is to gain a more complete understanding of the Village's sewer system, identify those areas which experience the worst flooding problems at the highest frequency, determine the cause of those problems in these high-severity areas and implement a set of solutions to address those issues.
